Henrico County NAACP expresses concern in the death of Irvo Otieno

RICHMOND, VIRGINIA – The Henrico County NAACP reacts to the arrest of seven Henrico County deputies in connection with the death of Irvo Otieno.

Terrell Pollard President of the Henrico County NAACP states:

"The Henrico County NAACP is deeply saddened by the death of Mr. Irvo Otieno on Tuesday, March 6th. The family of Mr. Otieno has our deepest condolences. No one should lose their life while in the care of those who swore an oath of Public Safety. Mr. Otieno's death is another painful reminder of the many unanswered calls for Mental Health Care, not just in Henrico County but across the Commonwealth of Virginia. A Mental Health Crisis should never be a death sentence.

While we agree with Henrico County Sheriff Alisa Gregory's decision to put the Sheriff Deputies involved on leave pending the outcome of the investigation, and the termination of the three Central State Hospital employees, we demand that all individuals responsible for the death of Mr. Otieno be held accountable and we urge the Sheriff's Office to be transparent and continue assisting the Virginia State Police in their investigation. The Henrico NAACP will monitor the case as it develops."

The Honoring Investments in Recruiting and Employing American Military Veterans Act of 2017 (HIRE Vets Act or the Act), requires the Secretary of Labor to establish a program, by rule, that recognizes employer efforts to recruit, employ, and retain veterans. Employer-applicants meeting criteria established in the rule will receive a "HIRE Vets Medallion Award.
