Jerryl Bennett has 36 years of Federal Service. He began his career in public service in the US Army and his employment with the US Department of Housing and Urban Development commenced in 2000. He served in several capacities of increasing responsibilities with the US Army and HUD. As a Field Artillery Officer, he led soldiers of diverse backgrounds as a Platoon Leader, Company Commander, and Brigade S1 - Human Resource Officer. He started his HUD career in Richmond as a Community Builder and held positions in Multifamily and Public Housing, with the most recent position as Liaison, Federal Interagency STEM Initiatives in the Office of Public Housing Investments. Currently, Jerryl's responsibilities span the country as he works with other federal agencies focused on reducing costs and leveraging corporate, local, state, and federal relationships to create/enhance both economic and social value for students and residents in Public Housing Agencies and surrounding communities. Working with early adopters and place-based Public/Affordable Housing communities, Jerryl uses innovative partnerships focused on collective impact, accountability, and transparency to align traditional and creative resources to achieve HUD's mission and Secretarial Initiatives. Efforts focused on people and transformative housing occur in place-based locations including HUD EnVision Centers, Opportunity Zones, Jobs Plus communities, ConnectHome, ROSS-Education, My Brother's Keeper, STEM/STEAM Innovation and Re-Entry.

Jerryl Bennett is a graduate of Choate Rosemary Hall, a New England preparatory school, and the United States Military Academy at West Point. Jerryl was also the Academy's first African American quarterback and a football record breaker. Community volunteerism is one of several pastimes for the native Texan. Bennett's affiliations include: lifetime membership in the National Black MBA Association, where he developed and launched of the *Leaders of Tomorrow* program for the Richmond chapter; a lifetime member of the West Point Society of Richmond and lifetime member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity – where he devotes a great deal of time leading and participating in community outreach initiatives; and has been recently named to serve as STEM Cluster co-chair for the White House Initiative on HBCUs.

Impacting social change and improving the quality of life for under-served groups through innovative and effective programming is a top priority for Bennett. To this end, he recently led a highly successful team - HUD Veterans STEM Innovation Networks - that was recognized by HUD for winning a prestigious Federal Gears of Government Award designed to sustain wholesome and interactive environments where fathers can create stronger bonds with their children living in Public Housing using STEM hands-on activities. His greatest leadership role to date is parenting and mentoring his children.

<u>Apply Today</u>

The Honoring Investments in Recruiting and Employing American Military Veterans Act of 2017 (HIRE Vets Act or the Act), requires the Secretary of Labor to establish a program, by rule, that recognizes employer efforts to recruit, employ, and retain veterans. Employer-applicants meeting criteria established in the rule will receive a "HIRE Vets Medallion Award.

Training topics will include:


