What are civil rights in a mental health setting?

- Be treated with respect and dignity.
- Have their privacy protected
- receive services appropriate for their age and culture
- understand treatment options and alternatives
- get care that doesn't discriminate on the basis of age, gender, race or type of illness.



Did you know?

The Baker Act - This law allows for the individual to be involuntarily held for up to 72 hours and may be initiated by mental health professionals, doctors, law enforcement officials and judges.

Some Challenges....

Public Psychiatric Beds in Virginia - A minimum of 50 beds per 100,000 people is considered necessary to provide minimally adequate treatment for individuals with severe mental illness. Like every state, Virginia fails to meet this minimum standard.

Criminalization of Mental Illness in Virginia

Like every state in the nation, Virginia incarcerates more individuals with severe mental illness than it hospitalizes.

Criminal Diversion in Virginia

Criminal justice officials are responding to the criminalization of individuals with innovative

programs designed to divert individuals with severe mental illness away from the criminal justice system. Two of the most promising programs are <u>mental health courts</u> and <u>crisis intervention</u> <u>training (CIT)</u>. *Mental health courts have not yet been implemented in Henrico County*.

- Black people are incarcerated at more than 5 times the rate of whites.
- 65 percent of Black adults have felt targeted because of their race. Similarly, approximately
 35 percent of Latino and Asian adults have felt targeted because of race.

When we see policies that unfairly target or penalize Black people in the criminal justice system, we must address these issues where they are — with laws and legislation, and with elected and appointed leaders.



Transportation Equity In The Commonwealth Series #2 - CLEAN SCHOOL BUS NAACP NATIONWIDE CAMPAIGN

Recently, NAACP launched the Electric School Bus Campaign - let's do our part to make sure it happens in Virginia!

Black students are more likely to have long-term health concerns due to environmental racism. Investments like the funding for the Clean School Bus Program will help to mitigate their exposure. Black and other people of color live in communities overburdened with significant levels of toxic greenhouse gas emissions that result from transit sources, including school bus tailpipe exposure. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Clean Bus Program is offering rebates to replace existing school buses with clean and zero-emission (ZE) buses. The goal is to replace existing outdated school bus fleets with clean, zero emission buses, to deliver safer, healthier, and more environmentally sustainable learning environments for children in communities that have been overburdened by pollution.

Join us to hear from NAACP representatives, industry experts, and community advocates to learn what you can to make sure your school district submits its payment request form and that the funds are distributed equally.
