
Banned Books Week celebrates the freedom to read and spotlights current and historical attempts to censor books in libraries and schools. For more than 40 years,

shared support of the freedom to seek and to express ideas, even those some consider unorthodox or unpopular. The books featured during Banned Books Week have all been targeted for removal or restriction in libraries and schools. By focusing on efforts across the country to remove or restrict access to books, Banned Books Week draws national attention to the harms of censorship.

What do you think?

The student loan repayment pause has come to an end, upending the lives of countless borrowers across this nation. Rest assured: We're not giving up.

Black borrowers remain disproportionately impacted by student loan debt, and immediate and sustained debt relief is essential to the Black community's economic future.



As we continue this fight, we want to make sure you're aware of the existing pathways to student loan debt relief:

Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF)

The PSLF program forgives the remaining balance on a borrower's Direct Loans after they've made 120 qualifying monthly payments while working full-time for a qualifying employer. Qualifying employers include government organizations, non-profit organizations, and other eligible public service organizations.

Saving on A Valuable Education (SAVE) Plan

Launched on August 22, the SAVE Plan is an income-driven repayment plan that can cut many borrowers' monthly payments to zero, save other borrowers around \$1,000 per year, prevent balances from growing because of unpaid interest, and move

reacner Loan Forgiveness

Are you or someone you know an educator? This program forgives up to \$17,500 in Direct Subsidized or Unsubsidized Loans or Subsidized or Unsubsidized Federal Stafford Loans for teachers who work full-time for five years at a qualifying school or educational service agency. Only certain subject areas are eligible.

Scholarship Details:

- Scholarships of up to \$5,000 will be awarded to qualified applicants.
- Awarded scholarships are limited to one per family per semester.
- Applications for the fall semester will be accepted Jan. 1 through April 30.
- Applications for the spring semester will be accepted Aug. 1 through Nov. 15.
- Fall semester scholarships will be awarded in August, and spring semester scholarships will be awarded in January.
- Scholarships must be used by the end of the school semester for which the veteran is applying or they will become null and void.
- Scholarships are restricted for tuition and fees only and will be paid directly to accredited schools.

Eligible Applicants Must:

- · Be a citizen of the United States.
- Be retired, honorably discharged, active duty, or a member of the National Guard or Reserve.
- Have completed Basic Training and follow-on training (Advanced Individual Training, technical school, etc.).
- Separated with or currently hold a military rank of E-5 or below.
- Demonstrate a need for financial assistance.
- Participate in, be accepted to or currently enrolled in a VA-approved program or school at an accredited post-secondary institution.
